



Dear Parents,

We are excited that you have decided to send your child to the Awana program. We are here to support you as parents as you raise your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord.

The goal of Awana is to reach boys and girls with the gospel of Christ and train them to serve Him. One way of reaching this goal is to work with your child to complete their handbook. The program is designed for clubbers to recite two(2) sections each club night. Parents need to work with their children during the week to help them memorize their verses or complete their section work. This doesn't need to be a big time commitment but it does need to be a consistent commitment. During the week, encourage your children to read through their verses and quiz them on them several times during the week. The more the families put in to their Awana work, the more they will get out of it.

Each child will have an opportunity to work one on one with their leader to recite the sections that they have prepared for the Awana night.

As a staff we are committed to having each child finish their handbook. Each child needs to come to Awana prepared for the evening with their book, their uniform and a minimum of one section completed. If your child goes two weeks without completing a section, the leader will call the parents to check on the situation. We understand that some children struggle with the memory work and Awana has many tools to help the process, for example the CDs. Talk to your leader for more ideas.

Again, we encourage you to work with your children as they prepare for Awana. We appreciate your partnership in this program. If there are any specific problems during the year, feel free to contact your leader, director or commander.
